For several years, MLKF has maintained a strong partnership with the Colombo Friends in Need Society (CFINS) in Sri Lanka, focused on providing young children with prosthetic limbs. Traditionally, these prosthetics were custom-made from plaster to suit each child's needs. However, a groundbreaking shift took place last summer, thanks to the support of the Rotary Club of Calgary, Canada, in collaboration with CFINS.

MLKF alongside our dedicated partner (CFINS) has been instrumental in the foundational support for this initiative through our previous grants of more than \$10,000.00 to make the collaboration possible and bring this innovative

solution to life.

Last year, with the cutting-edge work of Nia Technologies, 3D technology was introduced to produce prosthetic limbs for the first time in Sri Lanka. As a result, 20 children received advanced, 3D-printed prosthetic limbs from our grant, opening up new possibilities for a brighter future.

These state-of-the-art prosthetics, crafted with precision, are a leap forward in both technology and care. The well-fitted limbs allow children to move with greater ease, giving them a newfound freedom and mobility that significantly improves their daily lives. The impact goes beyond the physical abilities— this initiative restores a sense of normalcy, confidence, and hope. Children can now attend school without the obstacles they once faced, broadening their opportunities and setting them on a path to a better

Growing a Brighter Future at Kachebere Farm, Malawi, Africa MLKF gives a grant of \$2,000.00 for the fisheries project at the farm

Mary Lou Kalla Foundation (MLKF) is honored to partner with the St. Anthony's Farm Fishery project in Kachebere, Malawi, to make a lasting and meaningful impact. Malawi is one of the poorest country in the world. This brief report captures the farm's journey toward growth and sustainability:

Cultivating Prosperity: The farm has expanded its cultivated land from 61.28 to 82.03 acres, diversifying its crops and embracing innovations like drip irrigation to increase vegetable production and conserve water. The water retention ponds used for irrigation and supported by MLKF in prior years are vital for local farmers, ensuring a stable water supply and supporting income generation. These ponds have also been used to give opportunities to raise fish through fish farming. The local village community benefit from having fish in their meals.

Empowering the Workforce: The farm is powered by a committed team of twelve workers, all dedicated to its mission. Additionally, interns from Mwimba and Bunda Colleges of Agriculture gain hands-on experience alongside seasoned farmers, ensuring knowledge transfer and growth for the next generation of agriculturalists.

Building a Thriving Ecosystem: The farm's livestock



and the fisheries—including cattle, goats, poultry and fish—not only enrich the local protein market but also contribute to the farm's overall financial sustainability. This diversified approach reflects the farm's commitment to holistic and sustainable agricultural practices.

A Vision for the Future: With a clear aspiration to become the leading farm in Malawi by 2030, St. Anthony Farm's mission extends beyond agriculture. It's about supporting long-term financial sustainability, community empowerment, and shared
